The majority of the heirs of Thomas Noble dec'd having appeared at the Boone County Kentucky on Monday the 27th day of November 1835 to examine into and settle with the Executor the affairs of the Estate after a suitable investigation have ascertained the following to be the standing of the Estate To wit: Mariah Lindsey has received the negro Girl named Fina, Nancy Bush has received the boy named Edward Eliza Jones prior to her death had received the boy called Wesley. Matthew Syner has received the boy called Jerry. Fina and Nancy have received the Girl called Louisa. Frederick Noble has received the Girl called Eliza and the children of Elizabeth Winston have received the negro man called Morris. They have agreed that John B. Lindsey shall take one Cuffy and Nancy and his heirs relinquishing his claims against the Estate of \$160. shall pay the sum of one hundred and seventy five dollars in two years from this date. They have discovered that after supporting the family their remained goods and personal property at the death of Elizabeth Noble widow of Thomas Noble dec'd which was for one hundred and eighty dollars.  other all claims to the slaves, names respectively and set off &
 paid to the parties named. We further agree among ourselves
 that the said servants Thomas and Sarah his wife shall manumit
 of their as long and faithful service he set at liberty and
 be forever free from further servitude.
