In the name of God Amen. I Thomas Layton of Boone
County and state of Kentucky, being weak in body but of
sound and disposing mind and memory do make and
give this writing as and for my last will and
testament in manner and form following.
I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Betsey
Layton and to her heirs forever.
I give and bequeath to my son William Layton all my
silver spoons, (wells) Soup spoon, Table and tea spoons to
him and his heirs forever.
All the balance of my estate of every description both
real and personal I direct to be sold by my executors
for money at such price and at such time as they may

think proper, also to collect all debts due me as
they may think most for the interest of said estate
and I do authorize my executors to convey by deed or
otherwise the title to my real estate which they are
herein directed to sell, the proceeds of the whole, after
paying all my just debts to be divided in the
following manner, to wit: One third part to my
beloved wife Betsey Layton to her and her heirs forever
and the other two thirds I will and bequeath to
my son William Layton to him and his heirs forever
to be put out at interest by his guardians for his
use and benefit. But should the said William
Layton depart this life without lawful issue or
before he arrives at the age of twenty years; in
that case what I have here given & bequeathed
to him shall go to my said wife during her life
and at her death one half the whole amount
of my said estate to go to her heirs or assigns and
the other half to my nearest blood relations then
living.

It is my desire that Benjamin Johnson be appointed
Guardian for my said son William Layton
And lastly, I appoint my beloved wife Betsey
Layton Executor and her father Carew Johnson
Executor of this my last will and Testament
It is also my desire that all my meaning
appears of every description be at the disposal
of my wife and not be entered in my executor
inventory or valued.
