J. Williamson Price of the County of Boone and State
 of Kentucky being weak in body but of sound mind and dis-
 posing himself do make and ordain this to be my last
 will and Testament hereby revoking all former wills or
 codicils by me heretofore made.

First of all it is my will and desire that after my death
 my debts shoud be in number be paid as soon as they
 conveniently can be paid.

2nd I will unto my dear wife Nancy Price my
 homestead farm whereon I now reside during her
 natural life together with all my slaves stock of all
 kinds household and kitchen furniture debts dues
 and demands of every kind except such as may be here
 after excepted.

3rd It is my will that should my son Andrew mar-
 ry or arrive at full age before the death of my
 wife Nancy Price then and in that case it is my
 will that my son Andrew Price shall have por-
 tion of so much of the tract of land as is called the
 Cherry farm and should my wife live until my son
 Albert should arrive at full age or marry then
 and in that case he shall be entitled to a portion of
 the farm equal to that called the Cherry farm.

And it is my will and desire that should the death
 of my dear wife take place any time anterior to the
 aforesaid periods or whenever thereafter the said
 homestead farm to be equally divided between my
 two sons Andrew Price & Albert Price. And it
 is my will and desire that my son Andrew L.
 Price remain with his mother and that my wife
 Nancy have full power to sell and dispose of
 any of the crop or stock of any kind at any time she
 may deem it prudent & to the interest of the estate.
 4th It is my will and desire that my wife Nancy Price
 at all times during her natural life have the privilege
 of hiring out any of the slaves if she should think it
 to the interest of the estate and if at any time she should
 think the interest of my estate requires it for the benefit
 of any of my slaves to make sale of them whenever
 fair prices could be had.

5th I will unto my daughter Ann Price my tract
 of land near Burlington to her and her heirs for-
 ever and at the time of a division between my
 children it is my will that what the Burlington
 tract of land may be deficient in value shall be
 made up to her in money by my two sons who are
 to receive my homestead farm. It being my true
 meaning that each should be equal in all things.

6th It is my will that should either or all of my
 said children arrive at age before my wife Nancy
 Price death then and in that case it is my desire
 that they should be equal in all things.

Have or Shave as she may choose being particular at the time to ascertain the value so as to enable the parties to have an equal distribution in a final division of my estate.
 I do hereby nominate and appoint my friends Ben M. Dulaney & Lewis Corner Executors to this my last will and testament.
