silver spoons, (wells) Soup spoon, Table and tea spoons to
him and his heirs forever.
All the balance of my estate of every description both
real and personal I direct to be sold by my executors
for money at such price and at such time as they may

think proper, also to collect all debts due me as
they may think most for the interest of said estate
and I do authorize my executors to convey by deed or
otherwise the title to my real estate which they are
herein directed to sell, the proceeds of the whole, after
paying all my just debts to be divided in the
following manner, to wit: One third part to my
beloved wife Betsey Layton to her and her heirs forever
and the other two thirds I will and bequeath to
my son William Layton to him and his heirs forever
to be put out at interest by his guardians for his
use and benefit. But should the said William
Layton depart this life without lawful issue or
before he arrives at the age of twenty years; in
that case what I have here given & bequeathed
to him shall go to my said wife during her life
and at her death one half the whole amount
of my said estate to go to her heirs or assigns and
the other half to my nearest blood relations then
living.

It is my desire that Benjamin Johnson be appointed
Guardian for my said son William Layton
And lastly, I appoint my beloved wife Betsey
Layton Executor and her father Carew Johnson
Executor of this my last will and Testament
It is also my desire that all my meaning
appears of every description be at the disposal
of my wife and not be entered in my executor
inventory or valued.

In the name of God. Amen. I William Bates of Boone County and state of Kentucky, being weak and infirm in body but of sound mind and memory do make and Ordain this writing as and for my last will and Testament in manner and form following.

First. I leave unto my beloved wife Peggy Bates the Farm or plantation whereon I now live, containing One hundred acres more or less with the appurtenances thereto belonging to use and Occupy for her use and benefit during her natural life.

I also give and bequeath to my said wife Peggy Bates One equal third part of all my stock of Horses cattle sheep, hogs, and Crops of every description which may be on hand and remaining after my just debts are paid. But it is to be understood that this bequest is to be considered as in full consideration and in full discharge of any demand, my said wife may have against my estate, after my death for stock, household furniture &c. brought with her at our marriage and which is specified in a Marriage Contract existing between us.

Secondly. I give and bequeath to my grand son John H. Moore all the residue of my estate both real and personal, that is to say the tract of land whereon I now live containing about one hundred acres with its appurtenances after the death of my said wife Peggy Bates, also twenty acres adjoining the same which I purchased of John Brown also two hundred acres, adjoining Thomas Whitaker which I purchased of Joseph Warkins, also fifty three acres adjoining the same which I purchased of S. Whitaker also eighteen acres purchased of Humphrey Marshall all of which said several tracts with their appurtenances to the said John H. Moore & his heirs forever. Also five negro slaves (to wit.) Will about forty years of age, Phily about thirty, Roger about eighteen, Jenny about sixteen and Ann about sixteen months all of which to the said John H. Moore and his heirs forever.

For the faithful services &c. of my yellow man Matt who is about thirty two years of age he is to be set at liberty and I do hereby Will and bequeath to him his freedom which is to take place immediately after my death.

I do hereby appoint my grand son John H. Moore my whole and sole executor of this my last

will and testament hereby revoking all wills heretofore made.
