5th I hereby appoint my Uncle Johnson Watts the executor of this my last will and testament

In the name of God amen I, Samuel Sprigg of the County of Boone and Commonwealth of Kentucky being informed in Body. Thought of sound mind memory and understanding, and considering the certainty of death and having a desire to dispose of all my worldly estate myself I do hereby bequeath and dispose of the same in the following manner To wit:

In presence I do hereby give and bequeath unto my beloved cousin Sarah Canby the following slaves, Hunt, Race, Mary, Hagar, Charles, Tobias, Aragon, Camelia, also two thousand five hundred and in Cash one thousand dollars thereof to be paid her at my decease and the fifteen hundred dollars the residue thereof to be paid unto her in one year after my decease by my executor hereafter named. also my carriage and the harness belonging thereto. To gether with one equal share of all my plate, cupboard and house hold furniture (after deducting thereout such articles as I shall bequeath unto Richard King's County) to have and to hold the said slaves & other articles hereby bequeathed to the said Sarah Canby and to her heirs and assigns forever
