Will.

1st I give to my beloved wife, Margaret Lewis during her natural life the tract of land whereon I now live with its appurtenances also the following negroes of my family to wit: Matthew Lucy and Sally and her three children named Merina Amanda and Fanny and also her choice of my two negro boys Elijah and Sam which choice she is to make before the the sale or distribution of any of my property; also I give to her so much of my household and kitchen furniture stock of every kind and plantation tools as her self and my executor shall think proper and necessary and at her death all the yoresaid property to be equally divided among my children namely: Thos Lewis Nancy Terrill, Daniel Lewis Susanna Terrill Taylor Lewis Meranda Lewis Miller Lewis Fanny Lewis and John Lewis to them and their heirs and assigns forever.

2nd all the residue or balance of my property not named as above to be sold to the highest bidder and after paying my just debts the money to be equally divided among my children as above named.

But as some of them have received of my Estate in advance, my will is that those who have not shall first be made equal with those who have and then equally divided the balance. The advances made is advanced to is estimated as follows. To Thos Lewis and Daniel Lewis and hundred and thirty dollars each. To George Terrill and Nancy his wife and James Terrill and Susanna his wife two hundred and eighty dollars each. To Taylor Lewis fifty dollars.

3rd Whereas I am bound in a note with Nancy Ann in her security to pay a sum between Thos and Geo. hundred dollars which my Executors are hereby authorized to discharge as soon as practicable with out suit and also to make any arrangement or compromise with the said Nancy concerning the same as they may think proper.

4th If my wife shall ever marry in that case she is only to have of my property the tract of land above named with its appurtenances during the balance of her life and then to be divided among my children as above directed.

5th I hereby constitute and appoint Whitfield Early and my sons Daniel Lewis executors of this my last Will and Testament.
