I William Carpenter of the County of Boone and State of Kentucky, being in perfect mind and reason, do constitute the following as my last will and testament:

First, and above all things I recommend my body and soul into the hands of my Heavenly Maker, hoping for life and salvation in a world to come, through Jesus Christ our Lord Amen.

And as to the worldly effect, with which the Almighty has been pleased to bless me, I leave him and bequeath as followeth

First, I give to each of my children as soon as they shall have come to the age of one and twenty years or as soon as they shall have entered into a married state of life lawfully the sum of eighty Dollars or the worth of said sum, in some other property. I also give to each of my children a German and an English ~~with~~ ⁱⁿ Bible or Testament And a German and an English ~~with~~ ⁱⁿ Catechism - And a German and an English ~~with~~ ⁱⁿ hymnbook. Some of my children that is, Jeremiah, Jonathan, J. Augustus, Jacob, Smeal, Carpenter and Juliana Roush, Polly & Rice and Lydia Ayler have already received the same portion of their legacy in full, but our two youngest children William M. and Elizabeth Carpenter have not yet received this portion of their legacy in full they being younger age and I will that they shall also receive it in full in due time as stated above, that is as soon as they shall have come to the age of one and twenty years or sooner. If they enter into a married state sooner.

Secondly, I would ~~also~~ ^{also} oblige that I have now devised a portion of my landed property to four of my sons that is to say to Jeremiah, Jonathan, J. Augustus, Jacob & Smeal Carpenter which was lawfully executed and now recorded, or ready to be recorded in the Court of Boone County.

And as to the tract or parcel of land which I bought of John D. Marshall, situated on the road between here and Burlington on two main branches of Piney Run Creek and containing according to deed 438 acres more or less and by a recent survey 440 acres this said tract or parcel of land I give to my four daughters (viz) Juliana Roush, Polly, J. Rice, Lydia Ayler and Elizabeth Carpenter said land is bounded by Joshua Beaman Julius Roush, M. H. H. Daniel Barlow, Jeremiah Roush, Jacob Roush, Ephraim Ayler and others. I lately had a parcel of land laid off by the county surveyor M. Lewis Webb and divided by him into nearly four nearly equal parts or lots. It was done agreeable to my wish and well and much to my satisfaction. The different parts or lots were numbered by said surveyor N^o 1, N^o 2, N^o 3, N^o 4 as the plot of said land will show. And the lot which said surveyor styled N^o 1 containing an 108 acres be it more or less situate on the road from here to Burlington and adjoining to Julius Roush, Joshua Beaman, and others. A lot of land I give to my youngest daughter Elizabeth Carpenter and to her heirs forever with all the appurtenances thereof. And the lot which said surveyor styled N^o 2 containing 100 1/2 acres be it more or less adjoining to lot N^o 1 and M. H. H. Daniel Barlow and others said lot of land I give to my eldest daughter Polly & Rice and to her heirs forever with all the appurtenances thereof. And the lot which said surveyor styled N^o 3 containing an 113 acres be it more or less adjoining to Jeremiah Roush, Jacob Roush & others said lot of land I give to my eldest daughter Juliana Roush and to her heirs forever with all the appurtenances thereof. And the lot which said surveyor styled N^o 4 containing an 132 acres be it more or less adjoining to lot N^o 1 and lot N^o 3 to Ephraim Ayler, Thomas Ayler and others said lot of land I give to my daughter Lydia Ayler and to her heirs forever with all the appurtenances thereof.
