I agreeable to an order of the Boone County Court app
 pointing up appraisers to appraise the personal
 estate of Joel House Dec'd we met and after being
 duly sworn on the 30 day of April 1851
 met on to appraise all which was shown
 us by the Administratrix & ad which we report
 as follows - \$ 8000

 1 black horse 500
 1 young black horse 500
 1 black mare 400
 1 cow horse 3500
 1 white & red yearling calf 250
 1 heifer 2 years old 250

I am the 27th day, 1829. this day this is my wife and last testament that I do give all my estate to my wife Sally Jenkins for to have and to hold to (Wife) as she sees fit for the use and benefit of her and the children and all she is to pay out of said estate about one hundred and five dollars that I do give independent to John Jenkins about twenty three dollars one to James Steel fourteen dollars one to James Haydon 25 dollars to William Muslin 20 dollars and for further barrels and one half bushel of corn to Henry at one dollar and twenty five and for barrel.

William Jenkins his (Wife)

Further it is to be understood that the place now here on is not never to be sold as long as it grows and water runs but the heirs of my body is to enjoy the benefit thereof from one generation to another and that quarter of an acre on said farm where my wife sat trees this ground shall always be kept fenced in by the occupants of said farms as a grove yard for the said descendants to be buried in so long as the world stands.

This set myself William Jenkins.

It is to be understood that there is to be no settlement between my wife children of all the property or lands at our deaths.

On the first day of January 1830 Henry was hired to George W. Delay for one year for the sum of \$32.25
