Johnson Smith being weak of body but in
my perfect mind, doth make and Ordain
this my last will and testament in manner
and form as follows (viz.) I give to my
loving Mother Mary Smith Forty Acres of
Land lying in the County of Boone State
of Kentucky, the land that I purchased

of my grand father Benjamin Johnson
lying between the doublelick fork of
Wolfers Creek and John Stephens like also
Two feather Beds and all of their furniture
also one small mare, one Bunsaw, also
One note on George Martin Mingo for
thirteen dollars; bearing date the nine-
teenth day of September Eighteen hundred
and one. I further also do note on my
Brother Benjamin Johnson Smith for
thirty nine dollars; thirty five cents also
one note; One Thomas Mingo for Forty dol-
lars which is now in the hands of my
grand father Benjamin Johnson also
One note on Moses Fickers for Fifteen
dollars also in the hands of Benjamin
Johnson also my fathers note for sixteen
dollars seventy five cents also one cow
and calf in the hands of Benjamin
Johnson; One sheep at Gilmanes two
Cartwheels; in the hands of Benja-
min Johnson; also one tin pan, One
head of hogs and Every other species of
property that I have in my possession
with all due and demands that
I have against any person or persons,
Except all of my wearing cloths, which
give unto my loving Father Augus-
tine Smith the above mentioned pro-
perty for my Mother use to her and
her heirs forever: I constitute my
loving Mother Mary Smith my whole
and sole Executrix to this my last will
and testament whereunto I have set
my hands and seal this Twelfth of
October Eighteen hundred and first.
