William V. H. M. H. H. of Boone County and State of Ky.
being in very bad health and weak in body but
mind and memory as good as usual have thought it
best to make some distribution of what little estate
I have left and do ordain and make this my last
will and Testament.

In the first place I give to my little daughter Ann
Elizabeth the sum of fourteen hundred dollars to
paid her from the sale of my land and to be kept
at interest until she marries or becomes of lawful
age. Also I give her three negroes which were the
property of her mother namely Jane Tapp (this will
and said her bed bedding Churn and every thing
in my possession known to be her Mothers.

In the second place I give to my Nephew Albert
the sum of two hundred dollars as a token
of my love and respect for him.

All slaves I wish to be equally divided among my six
children by my first wife as situation and the nature
of the case will admit or as they can agree among
themselves. The balance of my Estate both real and
personal sold as my Executors may think best and
as they have all received considerable of my Estate
except Sally I wish every child but small child
which you can do by referring to a little Book where
you will find each child's account.

I also ordain and appoint Lewis Webb and Allen

G. McCon my Executors to this my last will and
Testament.

I do not wish my Executors to be compelled to give
any account to Court having full faith that they
will do what is right and just each other.

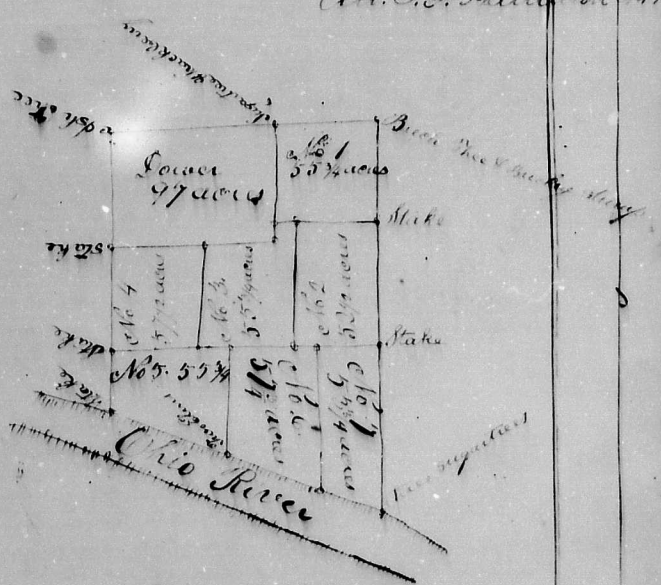

In Conformity to an order of Boone
County Court July Term 1838. appointing us Commissioners
to lay off the dower of Sally Hyle widow of John Hyle Sr.,
dec'd in the tract of land whereon the S. Hyle lived and
died we the undersigned Commissioners being duly
sworn do report that the afo^d tract of land according
to actual survey made by Lewis Webb surveyor of Boone
County contained 484 acres and that we allotted and set
about by proper metes and bounds 97 acres of which
including the dwelling house and other necessary
edifices of the dower of the said Sally Hyle and
the said tract of land and premises and further

That the aforesaid 99 acres is bounded as follows to wit. Beginning at a hack tree corner of the original tract thence with a line thereof N. 75° W. 114 poles to a stake thence S. 118° E. 134 poles to a stake thence S. 75° E. 100 poles to a sugar tree and hackberry in a line of Elijah Ryle thence with it and bearing his corner N. 75° W. 150 poles to the beginning. Given from under our hands as Commissioners aforesaid this 28th day of Aug. 1838.

We also further report that in conformity to an order of Boone Court August Term 1838 appointing us Commissioners to divide allot and set apart to each of the respective heirs of the aforesaid John Ryle Sr. Dec^d the residue of the foregoing tract of land by proper meets and bounds. That we proceeded to divide said tract of land and subdivided on the foregoing plat and allotted it to the heirs of said dec^d as follows to wit. To the heirs of John Ryle Sr. dec^d Lot 1st containing 55 3/4 acres. To Sarah Ryle Lot 2nd containing 52 1/2 acres. To William Ryle Lot 3rd containing 55 1/2 acres. To Elizabeth Ryle Lot 4th containing 55 1/2 acres. To Mary Ryle Lot 5th containing 55 1/4 acres. To Polly Hollister Lot 6th containing 57 3/4 acres.
