An agreement was entered into by the heirs or devisees of said dec'd and the Guardians of the heirs of Lewis Riddell and James Riddell and also the Guardian of Wesley Mitchell that the negroes of the said dec'd should be sold to the highest bidder among themselves and that the Commissioners should allot to the purchaser accordingly, in pursuance of said agreement the negroes of said dec'd were allotted and divided as follows to wit:

To John Riddell James an old negro man which he agrees to support free of charge to the said devisees for the sum of \$165. which amt is deducted from the total value of said slaves.
