Pursuant to an order of the Boone
County Court we Churchill Gaines Lewis Wells and
Mills Graves have this 10 day of Sept 1827. Proceeded to
make a division of the slaves belonging to the estate
of Mr. Rogers Deed among the Heirs of said Deed and
to allot each heir their proportion in the first place
we estimated the value of the slaves to be as follows
To wit

One woman named Charlotte	at	\$400.00
One man " do John "	at	400.00
One woman " do Sally "	at	325.00
One boy " do Jack "	at	40.00
One girl " do Kitty "	at	275.00
One boy " do George "	at	275.00
One boy " do Gabriel	-	225.00
One girl " do Lem	-	200.00
One do " do Sam	-	150.00
One boy " do Sam	-	130.00
One girl named Maria Louisa	-	160.00

Secondly, agreeable to another order of said court
we proceeded to allot and assign to Sarah Rogers, widow
of said Deed her dower out of the above slaves and accord-
ingly assigned to her said woman named Charlotte value
and the negro man John value at \$400. — \$400

Which she agreed to receive as her dower under the executa-
tion that she had received more than one third part of
the personal property of her said Deed husband. The particu-
lar state of which we upon examination find to be as follows To wit
that the Admrs sold a property which out slaves to the
amount of three hundred and a fifty seven dollars
09 3/4 cents and that the widow recd at the appraised
value \$279,9800 worth of property.

We further proceed to make a division of the remain-
ing slaves of said Deed among the Heirs, and valued
each slave which we done and do also report it as follo-
wing to wit. There being but nine slaves and three Heirs
we so arranged it, that the two most valuable slaves were
each to be given by two Heirs. The names and estimated
value of the slaves are as follows -

Jack - a boy valued at	\$400
Sally a girl valued at	325
Kitty a girl valued at	275

George a boy valued a	\$275 00
Gabriel do do	225 00
Linn a girl do	200 00
Isaac do do	150 00
Adam a boy do	130 00
Louisa a girl valued	100 00

Mr Rogers Pursuant to an order of the Boone County Court do to - Mr Churchill Gaines Lewis Webb & Wm Graves have perused this day 10th of Sept 1837 proceeded to set apart & allot an 2nd Dower to Sarah Rogers widow & child of William Rogers Decd, her dower in the land & house by said Decd at his death in the said County of Boone.

In the first place upon examination we find there to have left at his death at his death 6 or 7 acres of land all adjoining the tract where he lived and situated upon the waters of Wolf per & middle Creek - out of which tract he allotted & set apart 100 acres to include the mansion house and the greater part of the farm upon which said Sarah Rogers as his Dower includes all the land left by said Decd which has not been sold by a decree of the Boone County Court, upon a petition filed by the heirs of said W Rogers Decd and by a reference to the plot and deed the boundary will more fully appear.
