Being Continued that it is once appointed
for all to die. I am sensibly affected but per-
fectly in my senses first of all recommend my
body to its mother dust from whence it sprang
to be buried in a christian manner hoping
that in the morning of the resurrection I shall
rejoin it again in newness of life.

I wish to dispose of my property in the
following manner: all my real estate, my land
with the residue of money due to me and all
the rest of my property. I wish to give to my
young wife for the support of the children as
long as she stays a widow but if she marries
she is to have her dower and the rest of my
property to be equally divided amongst
my children. My negro boy named Reuben
I wish to be appropriated to the benefit of
my wife & children. Now from this day
and date I revoke & annul all other wills
testaments made by me. Therefore by appoint-
ing Reuben Ray and Jonathan Sanders to
be the executors of my estate - I ratify &
confirm this for my last will & testament which
I do my hand & seal this 8th day of March
1815

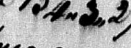
