Pursuant to an order of the Boone County Court appointing us as a Commission to sell the Estate of John A. Chapman deceased, Commissioners to lay off and divide a certain tract or parcels of land belonging to the Estate of J. A. Chapman deceased We the undersigned after being duly sworn before James Collins Justice of the Peace for the County of Boone proceeded under the direction and information given by the said Leonard P. Chapman and found the same to contain 173 1/2 Acres lying on the waters of Two mile Creek and bounded as follows to wit: Beginning at a red post and red Oak James Kennedys Corner thence N 89 W 128 p to two Sugar trees and a white Oak thence S 1/2 W 23 1/2 p to the line of John Gay to two Sugar trees in the line of J. Gay thence S 1/2 E 40 p to a white Oak and Hickory thence S 1/2 E 112 p to a Hickory in Planters line thence S 1/2 E 112 p to a white Oak thence N 2 E 81 1/2 p to the beginning containing 173 1/2 Acres, represented by the annexed sketch which shows and explains the several divisions given in this report.

We found upon information that the above tract of land had to be divided into nine parts the numbers of acres & Equates of the said J. A. Chapman which we divided according to quantity and quality equally into nine Parts (Approx) in the following manner (To wit):

1st Beginning at a red post in the north end of the said tracted tract of land parallel to the boundary line bearing N 89 W 128 p bounded as follows (to wit): Beginning at a red Oak and Walnut Kennedys Corner thence N 1/2 W 128 p to two Sugar trees and a white Oak thence S 1/2 W 23 1/2 p to a red and white Oak thence S 89 E 128 p to a white Oak thence S 1/2 E 23 1/2 p to the beginning which we appraised to Thomas E. Chapman one of the aforementioned white Equates Lot N 2 containing 18 acres situated parallel to Lot N 1 and bounded as follows (to wit): Beginning at a white Oak in J. Kennedys line corner to Lot N 1 thence N 89 W 128 p to a red and white Oak thence S 1/2 W 23 1/2 p to two Hickories and two white Oaks thence S 89 E 128 p to a white Oak thence S 1/2 E 23 1/2 p to the beginning which we appraised to James E. who interviewed next to the last Part Lot N 3 containing 18 acres to Leonard P. Chapman lying parallel to the Lot N 2 and bounded as follows (to wit): Beginning at a white corner to Lot N 2 thence N 89 W 128 p to 2 Hickories and 2 white Oaks corner to Lot N 2 thence S 1/2 W 23 1/2 p to 2 Sugar trees thence S 89 E 128 p to a white Oak thence S 1/2 E 23 1/2 p to the beginning Lot N 4 lying parallel to the aforementioned Lot containing 18 acres to Peter Dwyer and the wife of John Dwyer and bounded as follows (to wit): Beginning at a white corner Lot N 3 thence S 1/2 W 23 1/2 p to 2 Sugar trees thence S 1/2 W 23 1/2 p to 2 Hickories thence S 89 E 128 p to a white Oak thence S 1/2 W 10 p to a white Oak corner to Planters thence N 2 E 12 1/2 p to the beginning.
