In the name of God Amen I Gerah Tousey of the
County of Boone and State of Kentucky being of sound
mind memory, and understanding but aware of the
uncertainty of human life and that it is appointed for
all men once to die and feeling a wish to settle my
temporal affairs and distribute and dispose of my estate
after my decease, do make publish ordain and estab-
lish this as my last will and testament hereby first
revoking and making void any and all former wills
or wills Testament or testaments by me made or at-
tempted to be made. And 1st It is my will and
desire to be buried in a decent and respectable man-
ner suited to the solemnity of such an occasion.

2nd It is my will that all my just debts be paid
as soon after my decease as may be practicable by
my Executor herein after to be named and appointed.
3rd I hereby will and bequeath to my dear wife Ann
Tousey during her natural life the one third part of all
my Estate real personal and mixed and at her death
to be disposed of as herein after provided for.

4th I will and bequeath to my Grandson Gerah T.
Craig only child of my daughter Ann Craig deceased
the one half of the farm on Woodpecker which I purchased
of William Brockman together with the one half
of the mill or mills situated thereon and one half of all
the other appurtenances appertaining or in any wise be-
longing to said farm. Also the one half of the stock of
horses cattle sheep hogs and the one half of the farm-
ing utensils which may be at my decease. I also fur-
ther will and bequeath to the said Gerah T. Craig
my negro woman Rachard and all of her children
and increase and also the one equal half of the
balance of the slaves of which I may be possessed at
the time of my death. But it is further my will that
if the said Gerah T. Craig shall die without heirs
of his body that this and in that case the estate
herein bequeathed to him and all parts of my estate

which he would legally inherit shall vest in and be-
long to my only surviving son Crastus Tousey if living
if dead to the heirs of his body. And that the said
Crastus and his heirs enjoy the same free of any in-
cumbrances whatsoever.

5th It is my further will and desire that my said
son Crastus Tousey and my wife Ann Tousey have
the care and possession of all the estate herein willed
and bequeathed to my said Grandson Gerah T. Craig and
that they or the survivor of them may manage the same
to the best advantage for him until the the said Gerah
T. Craig shall arrive at the age of twenty one years and
in case of the death of my said son Crastus Tousey
before the said Gerah T. Craig shall arrive at the age of
twenty one years it is my wish and desire that the County
Court of Boone County shall appoint some discreet and
fit person to superintend and take care of the estate herein
before willed to the said Gerah T. Craig in the room of him
the said Crastus until the said Gerah T. Craig shall arrive
at the age of twenty one years requiring of the said person so
appointed bond with at least two good and sufficient securities
in such a penalty and with such stipulations as the
nature of the case and the law shall require in cases of
like nature.

6th My deceased son Annabelle Tousey having been
advanced to and received what I conceived to be a free
and equal portion or child's part of my estate in his
life time and in consequence thereof his only child Ann
Eliza Tousey being sufficient provided for I hereby will
and bequeath to the said Ann Eliza Tousey my (Grand-
daughter) the sum of ten dollars to be paid to her by
my Executor.

7th I hereby will and bequeath to my only remaining
son Crastus Tousey the residue of my slaves the rem-
aining half of the Brockman farm with the half
of the mill or mills and all the appurtenances of-
pertaining in any way to said farm to have and to
hold the same to himself and heirs forever. I also
hereby will and bequeath to the said Crastus all
my stock and farming utensils and personal property
of every kind not heretofore disposed of and I do hereby
further will and bequeath to my said son Crastus
Tousey all debts that may be due or coming to me at
my decease and all the money of which I may be
possessed together with all my estate which real

personals or mixed or of whatsoever kind or description it may be which has not herein before been especially disposed of the same to have and to hold to him and his heirs forever, hereby making and declaring the said Erastus Tousey residuary legatee to all my estate of what soever kind it may be, And it is further my will and desire that in case of the death of my said Grandson the said Zerah T. Craig or the death of my Granddaughter Ann Eliza Tousey without heirs of his or her body either before or after my decease, (I making no other disposition thereof) that the portion or part or estate herein bequeathed them or either of them so dying without heirs of their body shall go to and be vested in and belong to my son Erastus Tousey and his heirs forever, and I further hereby will and direct that the estate or portions herein before willed and bequeathed to the said Zerah T. Craig bear and contribute its equal part proportionate to the amt of the same towards the one third part of my estate willed to my wife Ann Tousey during her natural life and at her death the portion so devised to constitute out of what is herein willed to S. Zerah T. Craig to pass to him again under the same conditions which the balance of the bequest to him is subject and it is further my will and desire that the balance or residue of my wife Ann Tousey third at her death rest in and belong to my said son Erastus Tousey, it being my wish and desire that the specific and general legacies shall stand on the same footing and bear proportional parts in the one third herein before bequeathed to my wife Ann Tousey.

8th And lastly, I hereby nominate constitute and appoint my son Erastus Tousey & my wife Ann Tousey Executors to this my last will and testament. In testimony whereof I do hereunto set my hand and seal this 11th day of June 1839.
