I John Norton of the County of Bourbon and State of Kentucky being in a weak and low state of health do of my own mind and judgment do will and be-
queath my estate in the manner following - my be-
loved wife Sarah have the choice of four head of horses to be kept on the farm - Also six head of cattle - Also all the sheep that is now on the farm I wish to remain on the place for the use of the family and I have given to my eldest daughter Polly and Nancy about the sum of sixty five dollars I be-
queath the same amount of forty five dollars to each of my younger daughters viz. Patsy Peggy Catharine Sarah and Delcy - Also twenty of the choice of the hogs to be kept on the farm for the use of the family - I also bequeath to my beloved wife Sarah all the household and kitchen furni-
ture and farming utensils belonging to the farm during her natural life - Also one negro slave in the name of Sam to remain on the farm until my youngest son Spencer becomes of the age of twenty five years also the farm on which I now

live and the above mentioned negro boy Sam - I bequeath to my three sons viz. Benjamin John and Spencer to be equally divided among them at the decease of my wife the balance of the property on the farm not mentioned to be sold at Public sale some time in August next, the money arising from the sale is to pay my lawful debts and the balance is the report of the family also at the death of my wife Sarah I wish a sale to be made of all the property on the farm and the money to be equally divided among all my children - I do hereby name and appoint Robert Scott and Charles Peyton to be the Executors of this my last will and Testament - In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this twentieth day of March one thousand eight hundred and thirteen.
