4th I will to my daughter Nancy, five Shillings
Sterling.

5th I will to my Son Joseph five Shilling Sterling

6th I will to my daughter Sarah five Shilling Sterling

7th I will to my daughter Margaret five Shilling Sterling

8th I will and bequeath to my loving son James McKay
one grey horse, about 8 years old, with all my right of
any part that fell out to me at the last Administration
made by my Son James. — And further I do allow au-
thorise and empower him said James, to be my Exor. of
this my last Will, and Testament, and at my death and
afterwards, I do allow him to see and so justify to all my
Creditors, agreeable to this my last Will and Testament.

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and further my son James is to give unto my Daughter
Margret one new saddle — And further I will
unto my Son-in-law James Little, one English
Shilling & Co. — And for the further Confirmation of
this my last Will and Testament I do here publish
at my hands & feet, in the presence of three Wit-
nesses
