it is to be understood that my said wife is to keep po-
-sessions of the above mentioned plantation during her Wid-
-owhood. I likewise give and bequeath to my said
wife the old brown horse Sally and the black mare
flimnap and her colt three bed with furniture to be
worth thirty dollars each, likewise a pattern of curtains
now in the house, the Cupboards and furniture, a set of
the silver tea spoons and fifty four dollars worth of
property in sheep and cattle at their Appraisalment a bu-
reau and China cabinet and sugar dish and
one barbed plough and shovel plough, two new
pairs of the choice set of horse gear, two new
iron sweeps for window sash one half of the shan-
garn one ten gallon kettle, one six gallon kettle, one
three gallon pot bake oven and skillet three large
hopsacks and wheat fan.

Second I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Pres-
-cilla Tucker one hundred dollars including two beds
which she is to take at their Appraisalment out of the
hundred dollars and one young black mare side saddle.

Third I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Nancy
Tucker one hundred and forty five dollars in money
when she comes to the age of eighteen years.

Fourth, I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Re-
becca Tucker one hundred and forty five dollars
in money when she comes to the age of eighteen years.

Fifth, I give and bequeath to my beloved son Granbury Tucker
one block and fifty dollars in money when he comes to
the age of twenty one years.

It is my ^{wife's} desire that the black woman Anne be left to
my wife Eliza Tucker until the first day of January one
thousand eight hundred and fifteen and one negro

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girl named Rachel until she is twenty five years of
age ^{or one daughter named Ben until he is twenty five years of age} and her own side fiddle and thirty dollars in
money out of the fifty five dollars that is now in
the house. It is likewise my will that all the
grain of every kind and the whole stock of hog-
-s, and one half of the pure gain that is now
in the house is to be equally divided between my
three daughters Elizabeth, Fanny and Rebecca.

It is my will that all my personal property be sold and equally divided among my children except Aquilla and Greenbury who has yet by legacy all that I designee giving them only Aquilla is to have forty dollars above out of the proceeds of the sale of said property. It is also my will that black Lucy and her children be set at liberty to work to earn their freedom from this time henceforth; and that my executors here after mentioned shall cause a record to be entered in toward to that amount.

Lastly I appoint my beloved son Squillas
Tucker, and my wife Eliza Tucker readers to
this my last will and Testament. In Testimony
