Now I give and bequeath unto my sons Preston Washington and Roddy Breckenridge my tract of land lying on Righters Creek in Henry County in Tennessee State to be divided equally agreeable to quantity, equally between the three Brothers and I appoint George Breckenridge their Guardian to take care of their lands until they come of age - also it is my will and desire that my Daughter Jenny Breckenridge shall have a full share of all my other property equal with her three Brothers Preston, Washington and Roddy Breckenridge - also it is my will and desire that if Eddy Breckenridge should die before he has a family that his part of the said which I devised to him be equally divided between my two sons Preston and Washington Breckenridge - also it is my will and desire that all my negroes except Peter shall be sold unless my wife Polly Breckenridge should choose to take her third or a part thereof out of them and if she
