Certificate is granted him for obtaining probate thereof in due form.

I Alexander Brown, being in a sick & low condition but having the perfect use of my reason do ordain & constitute this as my last will and testament. All Just debts shall be paid out of my estate, Elizabeth my wife shall have the full & exclusive right to one negro woman named Dinah, also to a boy mare named Doll, and her saddle & bridle, also all the house hold furniture of which I am possessed, and one third part of my land during her life or

widow hood, and one sixth part of the remainder of my moveable property. My Land shall be equally divided between my two sons John and James and each of them shall have a good horse saddled bridle at the age of twenty one years, and a decent suit of clothes. The remaining part of my estate shall be equally divided between my three daughters, Nancy, Jane & Elizabeth. My negro man named Mosy shall continue in servitude for the space of ten years, from the present time, and if he behaves well and labors faithfully during that time, he shall thereby be free. My negro man named Andy shall continue in servitude for the space of fifteen years, and if he behaves well & labors faithfully during that time, shall thereafter be free, they shall continue respectively during the different periods of time above mentioned, under the direction of the Executors of this my last will & testament and the produce of their Labor, shall be applied to the use of the Legatees of my estate, and towards educating my children above named, My children as soon as capable of receiving education, shall all be learnt to read distinctly, and to write a plain legible hand, and my two sons a competent knowledge of arithmetic. If any part of the Land on which my improvement is made, should be taken by a better title, I desire that the executors of my will should purchase so much thereof as will secure the buildings and improvement to the use of the Legatees, and if it cannot be obtained on more advantageous terms to exchange a part of my

unimproved land for the same, I appoint William Henry Jeremiah Frame & David Purviance Executors of this my last will & Testament. Given under my hand and seal this 29th day of October 1795.
