It is my will that my negro girl Sally and my Negro Moses shall go free at my death or return to their parents, Moses and Lucie. It is my will that if said Moses and Lucie do take good care of me while I live that they shall be rewarded for their trouble and the reward to be judged of by two or more honest men chosen by the Executors and said

Moses— It is my will if there is any thing remaining that it shall be disposed of as follows: viz. that my daughter Jenny shall have the bed on which I lie with bolsters and pillows blankets a sheet and covered — It is my will that my Daughter Foster Alexander shall have the other bed with a blanket sheet and covered bolsters and pillows — It is my will that my grandson Alexander shall have my blue boat and my blue velvet jacket and breeches It is my will that my grandsons John and James Brown shall have the use of my bay mare her coats shall be their property — It is my will that my step son William Henry shall have black coat It is my will that my son John Brown shall have my great boat and my black velvet jacket that I wore — It is my will that my step son James Junks shall have three head of sheep.

I do appoint and ordain my grandson John G. Brown and my step son William Henry my Guardians and Executors of this my last will and testament, given under my hand and seal this 9th of August 1807. Alexander ^{his} Brown (read)
