Attention In the name of God I, William L. Henderson
 will. Henderson of the County of Bourbon and State of
 Kentucky being of perfect mind and memory, but
 calling to mind the Mortality of my state, think
 proper to make this my Last will and Testament
 in the following manner. First I desire my
 Body to be decently buried in a Christian like
 manner at the discretion of my Executors.
 I give and beise to my son Robert Henderson
 the plantation where I live on to him and his
 heirs

He's friend, and ^{my} my fellow names. Sen.
 I also give to my son Robert Henderson all my
 horse, beatures Except such as I shall hereafter
 mention and the one half of my stock of
 Cattle I also give to him all my farming
 utensils. I give and devise unto my sons
 Samuel Henderson & James Henderson and
 Robert Henderson, Each of them twenty pounds
 that is now in the hands of my son Joseph
 Henderson, and the ballance that rests in his
 hands, I desire may be Equally divided between
 my sons. Alexander, David, Joseph and Saml.
 Henderson. I also give to my son Samuel Hender-
 son about that Snow paper. I give to my
 Daughter Florence Henderson a dun Mare and
 her three colts and their increase, and the one
 half of my ^{stock of} cattle. I devise to my son George
 Henderson twenty nine pounds that is now
 in his hands. I give to my grand son Alexander
 Henderson, being my son John Hendersons
 son five shillings. I give my Daughter Jane
 Beatty one bed and, also to my Daughter Florence
 Henderson, and my son Robert Henderson all
 my goods including the Cattle furniture &
 Carg

Every kind, to be Equally divided between them.
 I also give to my son George Henderson my white
 boat and Jackcoat and the ballance of my clo-
 thing to my son David Henderson. Lastly I consti-
 tute and appoint my sons Samuel Henderson and
 David Henderson Executors of this my Last will
 and Testament. October the 30th 1791.
