This account of the sales of the Estate of Stephen Grimes deceased was produced in Court and being examined was approved of and is therefore duly recorded in this Office

In the name of God amen, I Jonathan Dazey of Bourbon County and State of Kentucky being weak in body but sound in memory and knowing that it is appointed me for all men to die I now make my last will and testament wherein I do bequeath unto my six sons all my real and personal Estate to be divided in the following manner first unto my son Lemuel Dazey I give fifty dollars and to my son Jasper Dazey I give ten dollars and to my son Elijah Dazey I give ten dollars, and to my other three sons Michael Dazey, Ishmael Dazey and Jonathan Dazey I give two hundred and forty dollars each and one bed and furniture unto my son Jonathan Dazey and after my just debts and funeral expenses is paid then all and every thing of my real and personal Estate to be equally divided between my six sons above mentioned, But with this exception my sons is not to sell or trade of one nor any of my black people to any person or persons without the consent of such black person or persons, And be it further remembered that I do appoint my sons Lemuel Dazey and Ishmael Dazey to be the sole Executors of my Estate whereinunto I set my hand and seal this fifteenth day of August one thousand eight hundred and fourteen

Andrew Cochran of Bourbon County and State of Kentucky do make this my last will and testament being low of body but sound of mind, First I do commit my soul to God and my body to the earth I do will and bequeath all my Estate and every species of property and all the money that is owing to me on the hands

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hands of any person, to my two daughters Sally
Ferguson & Polly Rayburn to equally divide between them
after my Daughter in law Polly Cochran gets as much
as will purchase her a dress, and all lawful debts discharg-
ed, and after my three sons gets each of them one dol-
lar and Polly Tichenall also one dollar. I do appoint
Gleason Ferguson and Cornelius Rayburn to be the
Executors of this my will and testament, I do here-
by revoke every other will or testament made by me
and declare the same to be null and void. At Wit-

In the name of God Amen I Reuben George of Bour-
bon County and State of Kentucky knowing the uncer-
tainty of life and being very weak and low do
make this my last will and testament, first, I recom-
mend my soul to God and my body to be buried in
the earth, then all my just debts to be paid out of
my Estate, after my debts are paid, I give unto my
dearly and well beloved wife Nancy George all my
Estate during ^{her} life my negroes I dispose of in the fol-
lowing manner, the three grown ones viz, Tolbert, Mary
and Nilet I wish, and direct to be set free in ten years
from the present date unless ^{the} Executors should think
after

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after my personal property is sold and debts collected that
there is sufficient to support the widow comfortably, then
I leave it optional with my Executors to emancipate them
earlier if they think proper. I also wish Tolbert and Mary to
be hired out until and four children I wish to live with my
wife Nancy George, unless she and my Executors should think
it would be more advantageous to hire them out, I then direct
my wife to keep a girl called Harriet to wait on her during
her life. I also direct my Executors to put to trade five negro
male children when they shall deem it necessary the trade
they will make choice of, viz) Lonett Joe Tom Curvel Sunday
I also direct my Executors to emancipate the five boys above
mentioned when they shall deem it necessary - keeping in view
the comfortable maintenance of my wife during life - and
I solemnly forbid their being kept in slavery for any other
purpose, or any longer time than is sufficient for that purpose
my property of every kind to be sold (Negroes excepted)
My wife Nancy George shall be at liberty to keep such person-
al property as she thinks proper, the money to be put to interest
and managed to the best advantage by my Executors.
I also give to my negro man Tolbert when he shall be eman-
-cipated one horse worth thirty dollars one plough and tack-
-ling one narrow axe one cow one weeding hoe to be taken
out of my estate or the money arising therefrom I also direct
at the death of my wife to emancipate all my slaves old and
young male and female immediately. I also direct at
the death of my wife Nancy George the money and proper-
-ty yet ~~remaining~~ ^{unconsumed} of my Estate shall be disposed of as follows
My wife Nancy George shall will to whom she pleases one third
of the remaining Estate the balance to be divided equally
between my three nieces, viz) Harriet Pitt Lucinda George
and Fanny Cleveland, and I hereby nominate and ap-
-point William McHaddon and Lewis P. Scroggie to exe-
-cute this my last will, Given under my hand and seal
this 2^d of Sept. 1844
