will and Testament in manner and form
following viz first I recommend my soul to

at the discretion of my Executors and after
my just Debts and funeral charges are
paid

my will and Test^{ment} is that the worldly goods
it has been pleased God to endow me with, also be disposed
of in the manner and form following I give and
bequeath to my Loving wife Elizabeth Lydick my
whole estate real and personal during her widow
hood and if she marries again to have her full third
of my estate and the other two parts to be ^{equally}
divided amongst my children agreeable to Law
and Lastly I appoint my Loving wife Elizabeth Lydick
Sole Executrix of this my Last will and hereby
revoking all wills and bequests by me formerly
made & I pronounce and declare this my Last
will and Testament In Witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and seal this fifth day of
November eighteen hundred and seven - 1807

This Last will and Testament of Andrew Lydick
decd was returned into Court and proved
by the oaths of Rush^d. Biddee and Robert
Willmott Witnesses thereto and ordered to be
recorded & And on the motion of Elizabeth
Lydick the sole Executrix named in the
said will who made oath thereto and together
with John Lydick and John Lytton her Secu-
rities entered into and acknowledged their bond
in the penalty of £2000. conditional as the Law de-
reals cert^y make & granted her &c. obtaining a probate
thereof by her own John Lamb Esq^r
