That is to say principally, and first of all, I commend my soul into the hands of almighty God who gave it, and my body I recommend to the Earth to be Buried at the discretion of my Executors.

And as touching such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to endow me with in this life, I give, and devise unto my loving wife Peggy, and my children, Thomas, Molly, Betty, Nancy, & Amey Payne, to be equally divided between them.

I appoint and desire my wife Peggy Payne Executrix, & my Brother Mayford Payne Executor of this my last will & Testament, sealed with my seal this third day of January one thousand seven hundred and Ninety six.

Signed and sealed by the said Joseph Payne his last will & Testament, in presence of us, who in his presence have hereunto set our names.
