In the name of God Amen--
I John Hopkins of the County of Bourbon and Common wealth of Kentucky being afflicted in body but sound in judgment and memory doth in these presents make this my last Will and Testament first through the will and mercy of God. I do bequeath my soul to him who first giveth and my body to the dust. Secondly my Plantations that I do now live on I leave to my loving wife with one third of my movable Estate and as my wife decease the above plantations to my son George Washington Hopkins and a Horse Bridle and Saddle and I also will and bequeath to Easter Hopkins a Horse Bridle and Saddle and a good Cow and calf. I also will bequeath to Peggy Hopkins a Horse head Bridle and Saddle and a good Cow and calf with all my House hold furniture to be equally divided between Easter and Peggy and the remainder of my Estate to be equally divided amongst all my children. And I also will and constitute my sons George W. Hopkins and John Hopkins to be my Executors according to law as far as it is agreeable to this my last Will and Testament in year of our Lord this second day of November 1813.

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In the name of God Amen I Richard Arrowsmith of the County of Bourbon and State of Kentucky being weak of body but having my perfect senses and knowing the mortality of man and that it is appointed for all men ^{once} to die do make this my last Will and Testament. First I recommend my soul to Almighty God that gave it me and my body to be decently buried.

Item, I give and bequeath unto my well beloved wife Sarah Arrowsmith all my land and personal Estate during her natural life or Widowhood it is my will that my well beloved wife shall after my decease sell off as much of my personal Estate as will pay all my just debts and that she keep the balance of my Estate in her full possession during her natural life or Widowhood and after the death of my well beloved wife Sarah Arrowsmith it is my will that my land and personal Estate be then sold and equally divided amongst my well beloved children viz Mary Languecker William Arrowsmith Rebecca Samriott Alexander Arrowsmith John Arrowsmith Margaret Arrowsmith Elizabeth Arrowsmith Sundry Arrowsmith Levina Arrowsmith Alva Arrowsmith James Arrowsmith and Sny Arrowsmith Also I leave my well beloved wife Sarah Arrowsmith Executrix to my Estate. Do witness my hand and seal this fifteenth day April in the year of our Lord God 1814.

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It becometh I feel myself in a low state of health and weak in body but strong in mind and in my proper senses though I think it my duty to commend myself to God who gave me my being. It is my will and desire that after my funeral expenses and all my lawful debts paid that my Estate should be disposed of as follows. It is my will and desire that my dear and beloved wife Sarah Wright should have one half of my Estate during her Widowhood both here and abroad but it is to be understood that if she marries she shall have but one third of my Estate it is my will and desire that my wife Sarah Wright should have all the claim in a proper and in full that land and improvements on Red river. It is my will and desire that my Daughter Louisa should have half of my Estate provided the widow should not marry but if the widow should marry Louisa to have one third of my Estate. It is also my desire that my wife Sarah should maintain and educate my Daughter Louisa and if the widow should marry the expense to be paid out of the child's portion but if the widow should not marry the expense to be paid out of the widow's part. It is also my will and desire that my Daughter should have a bed and furniture also an upper room saddle and twenty dollars in cash it is my will and desire that that lot of land of two acres in Spring Town should be sold with the molding factory with all the improvements thereon and such credit may be given by my Executors as appears most advantageous to the Estate all my goods and chattels of every description to be sold at public sale except such as the widow sees proper to take in the appraisement.
