I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Jane Williams the sum of two hundred dollars besides an equal part of all my Estate that I now possess with my other children. It is my will that after she the above named Jane receives the above sum of two hundred dollars that the residue of all my estate of every Description whether personal or real be equally divided amongst my other children. viz. Jane is also to have an equal share after receiving the above named Legacy of two hundred dollars. Also it is my will and desire that my Negroes man Moses shall be a free man at my death. And I do hereby appoint my beloved sons Cape Williams and Bedford Williams Executors to this my last will and Testament and do hereby revoke and disannul all and every will or testaments by me made heretofore. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the twenty ninth day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred, and eight in presence of us

In the name of God, I am being of sound mind and memory considering the mortality of my body. I have thought, resolved make this my Last will and Testament, in manner and form following, that is, I do hereby appoint my son Amos Buddell and my son in law John Huelthering my lawful executors, to have the my wife's share & performed as fair as they are able, so to do that is in the first place to have my body decently buried & all my just debts paid, I then give and bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth Buddell one third part of all my Unblested during her Natural life, Likewise will and Bequeath her the one third part of my home plantation with the buildings and Appurtenances thereunto belonging with two negro slaves, that is George and Carter, which Negroes are to be set free from slavery at the Dies, Likewise all her grain is to her grounds, tale trees, I give and bequeath to my two sons, Namely Amos Buddell and Abnerham Buddell three hundred and ninety acres, has been already layd off on the west side of the river now lies on and to be divided equally between them as much best suits themselves, And to my son in law John Huelthering I give and bequeath two hundred acres as it is more or less, but if no prior right shall take the two last

and Credit to the said pounds, nine shillings and 8¹/₂ leaving a balance of six hundred and sixty pounds, sixteen shillings and 8¹/₂ in favour of said Estate.
