Item I lend to my beloved wife Ann Walker after my just debts are paid my whole Estate during the term she remains my Widow.

Item, After the marriage or death of my said wife my will and desire is that my Estate of every description be equally divided between my children, the child my wife is now carrying, if it should live to share equal with my other children. Lastly I appoint my friend Anthony Thornton Jr my brother, and Walker Buckner my brother in law, Executors of this my last will. 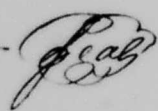
