Sixthly I give and bequeath to my daughter Frances Humphrey wife of George Humphrey one negro Girl named Eler also one negro girl named Sarah after my wifes decease also the one sixth part of all my personal Estate not herein otherwise disposed of.

Seventhly I give and bequeath to my daughter Lacey Stevens wife of Joseph L. Stephens one negro girl named Kelly also one naince Rachel also one naince Grace with one woman named Hannah after the decease of my wife Elizabeth Gannard also the one sixth part of all my personal Estate not herein otherwise disposed of with one feather Bed and furniture.

Eighthly I give and bequeath to my two grand children Elizabeth Hughes and Sarah Hughes Daughters of George Hughes and Elizabeth his wife one negro girl named Mance to be equally divided between them when they come to the age of fifteen.

Ninthly I give and bequeath to my three grand sons namely Daniel Hughes and Releph Hughes and William Hughes son of George Hughes and Elizabeth Hughes my Daughter the one sixth part of all my personal Estate not herein otherwise disposed of to be divided equally between them when they are of the age of twenty one years.

And its expressly to be understood that if any claims rights or interferences should take the whole or any part of the aforesaid forty acres of land which I have willed unto my wife Elizabeth Gannard she shall then have a right to take thirty acres of land out of any of my land which I am in possession of at my Decease and her natural life but is to be the soul property of Thomas Gannard at her decease I also will that my slave Anthony shall be sold to defray my just debts if any.

I do hereby constitute and appoint my wife Elizabeth Gannard

with Thomas Gamara Manaw Bates and Joseph & Stephens to be my lawful Executors and to have this my last will and testament duly executed so far as is in their power so to do and I do by these presents renounce and revoke all my former wills by me made or done and acknowledged published and pronounced this to be my last will and testament dated and signed in the presence of me this twenty eighth day of March one thousand eight hundred and seven
