ing in perfect health of Body and sound in mem-
ory and mind but calling to mind the mortality
of my body and that it is appointed for all men
once to die do ordain this my last Will and Testa-
ment and first of all I give my soul to the Al-
mighty God who gave it me hoping to receive
the same again at the General Resurrection through
the mighty power of Christ my great redeemer
my body at my decease I recommend to the
earth to be buried in a decent Christian like
manner at the discretion of my executors
whom I shall hereafter nominate and appoint and
said expenses to be paid by my two sons Robert
and John Wright and touching such worldly
possessions wherein with it hath pleased God
to bless me with in this life I give and bequeath the same
in manner and form as followeth (viz) first of all
I will and allow that all my just debts shall be
paid out of my Estate I then bequeath to my
