In the Name of God, Elijah Poston of the State of Kentucky and County of Bourbon, being in a very weak and sickly condition but sound of mind, I have thought proper to make this my last will and Testament as follows, (Viz)

First, I do leave my son Samuel Poston and William Poston Executors of this my will and I leave to my beloved wife Luanna Poston my plantation with all the appurtenances thereto belonging together with all my slaves during her life unless she should be willing to give them up, it is also my will and desire, that my slaves and their increase shall serve until they are fifty years of age and if my said woman Luanna should have ten children before she is fifty years old she shall be free. It is also my will that, when a division takes place amongst my children that my son John Poston shall have fifty dollars more than his equal parts. It is also my desire that my daughter Sally Poston shall have her maintenance of the plantation so long as she lives with her mother - this my last will from under my hands and seals this 13th day of September 1811
