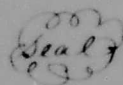


In the name of God Amen. I Elizabeth Sair widow of Bourbon County and state of Kentucky being very weak in body, but of perfect memory, and calling to mind the mortality of my body, knowing that it appointed for all men once to die, firmly believing that by the mighty power of God I shall receive the same body again at the resurrection of the dead and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me with in this life, I Give and devise the same in the following manner Viz. First of all I recommend my body to to the Earth to be buried in decent and christian manner, at the direction of my Executors and my funeral charges to be paid out of my personal Estate, Secondly, I Give and bequeath to my wife below a Mother three fourths of my personal Estate, likewise the same part of all my real Estate, to be paid by my Executors, thirdly I Give to my below a Brother John Sair the one fourth of all my personal Estate, also the fourth of all my real Estate, to be paid him when he is at full age, likewise I appoint George Smiser my Sole Executor to execute this my last will and Testament, denying all former Executors by me appointed, and all Wills, and former legacies and bequests, and ratifying this only to be my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I hereunto set my hand this eighteenth day of March Eighteen hundred and three
