In the name of God, Amen, I Enos M. Daniel of the County of Bourbon and state of Kentucky, do make this my last will and Testament in manner and form following, that is to say, First of all I give my body to Earth from whence it came, and my soul to my God, whom of right it is, and touching such worldly goods as it has pleased God to bless me with, I dispose of them in the following manner, first I give to my beloved wife Isabella M. Daniel one Negro Girl named Cuffy for and during her lifetime, and to be returned to my estate at her death and also I leave her the sum of nine pounds to be paid to her in present instalments for her maintainance, every year during her lifetime, and also one barrel of cider per year when the fruit sells.

I give to my son Alexander M. Daniel the one third part of the tract of land which I once gave him containing 100 acres to him and his heirs forever. The ballance of the said tract of 100. acres of land I give to my two sons John M. Daniel and Rowland M. Daniel, to be equally divided between them, to them and their heirs forever. And also and singular the ballance of my estate of every description (including the Negro Girl Cuffy whose name at the death of my wife) I give to my beloved sons, Robert M. Daniel, Francis M. Daniel, John M. Daniel and Andrew M. Daniel and their heirs forever, to be equally divided amongst them after taking out the sum of six pounds in property which I give to my daughter Jane Deora her and her heirs forever. — And lastly it is my will that no Inventory be made of any part of my said estate but

that my ~~sons~~ ^{sons}, Robert, Francis John and Rowland, make the
 divide among themselves, but in case any disagreement should
 take place among them, (which I heartily pray, ^{may} never happen), do
 hereby appoint my ^{trusty} friends George Givens, Benjamin Kendrick
 and Charles Smith junior, in my stead to settle such differences and
 to allow to each one of my said children, that which in right
 they ought to have, And I do hereby require of all my children
 herein named, strict attention and compliance with this ^{my}
 last clause of my will. In testimony whereof I have hereunto
 set my hand and seal this 20th day of August 1802.
