I George Bournaugh being in a low state of health, but thanks be to
God, of sound mind; and taking into consideration that it is unavai-
able of all flesh, once to die have thought proper to make this
my last will and testament of the worldly goods that God in his
Providencia hath been pleased to bless me with.

First I do resign my body to its mother dust and my dear companion
is to have her thirds of all my Estate after my debts paid, and my daughter
Polly to Bournaugh is to have her choice out of my stock of horses
after my son George Bournaugh gets his first choice out of my stock
of horses. My plantation that lies on Kentucky, I do leave to my sons, George
and Thomas Bournaugh, to be equally divided in quantity, quality,
but my Newborn must ^{pay} the other three children their equal share
of the land and property, that is to say Polly, Peggy and Susan;
except the low house that is before mentioned; and my companion
third which is to be hers as long as she lives, and at her death
to be equally divided between my five children that now live with
me. My daughter Polly is to have her bed and the furniture
that belongs to it, over and above her share that is before mention-
ed and my daughter Betty is to have the cow that she got the on
the twenty eighth day of October last, and she is also to have four hog
to fatten this present fall, and my son John Bournaugh I do leave him
one dollar. And I do hereby appoint my wife to take care of this my
last will, to have it recorded according to law. As witness and
deed this 2nd day of November 1810.
