mainder of my Estate, including her natural life, excepting
one horse, Cattle some of my old man's Cattle, one set of plow
Irons, one Pole Ax & Mattock and broad Ax, & one Rifle
Gun and one Cow, one Ewe and Lamb that I do give to my son
John Lail when he becomes of age, and one Cow, one Spinning
Wheel, to Catherine Lail daughter of Peter Lail
deceased what she is to have when she becomes eighteen years
of age, and at the decease of my beloved wife, Margaret had
the said Irons this is, containing two hundred Acres to be
equally divided in quantity between my son George Lail
and John Lail, if the said George Lail does not come and
apply for the land, my son John Lail, including the improved part
of the land, is to have the same. If the said George Lail
does not personally apply for his part of the land, the above
mentioned John Lail is to have the two hundred Acres and
the land and I do hereby give in witness, and bearing 351
and in duplicate, that shall be necessary for the same.

But we stop at this and say as to the balance of
 all my largest Lot, and at his decease the same to be
 the remains of my personal Estate (only my Wife & children
 in joint Lot) to be equally divided among Sarah Elizabeth
 and August Linwood and Charles Warren & George Linwood
 joint lot, then a like deed lawfully begotten of him last
 If my son George Linwood does not personally apply to divide
 the personal Estate then it is to be equally divided among
 my four above mentioned Children. I do hereby constitute
 and appoint my beloved wife Margaret Linwood, and Andrew
 Linwood, and Andrew Linwood to be my Executors, whom I
 have given from under my hand and fixed my Seal, this the
 second day of July, one thousand four hundred & ninety three
 A.D.
