horse called Hatter to dispose of as she thinks proper
I also give my said wife during her natural life
one half the farm where I now live on including the
house where I now live with all the furniture as
they now stand. - I also give my said wife during
her life as follows for negroes Sunny wife to Rasper
Elmer, Peter and Valantine, Rasper and Tom and
half of my cattle, sheep and hogs, also one half of
the crop on the farm.

2. I give to my son Edmund Montjoy five
hundred acres of land in Beaufort County lying
on Fivecote including a sett of hogs called and known
by Sellers as Licks I also give my said son Edmund
one negro woman called Liddy and her child
called Sunny, one girl called Ursula one boy
called George the above mentioned five hundred
acres of land and four negroes & their increase I
give to my said son Edmund and his heirs forever.

3. Give to my son George Montjoy his one
half the tract of land in Beaufort where I now live
the said tract includes two hundred and thirty four acres

391. and do hereby give, sell, convey and assign my said son George
 the other half of the above tract of Land where
 now lies - I also give my said son George & his
 line negroes as follows: Lucy, Hannah and Milk.
 I also do hereby give, sell, convey and assign to my
 son George and his heirs forever - Also the above

 one acres -

I give to my son George and his heirs forever
