In the name of God Amen
to all whom it may concern I George Wilson of Bourbon County Kentucky being low and weak in Body but of a sound mind after giving my soul to him who gave and my Body to the grave do ordain constitute and appoint sons William and Hamilton Wilson and wife Elizabeth Wilson admors and do by these presents make this my last will and testament as follows (to wit) I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth Wilson one third part of the tract of land on which I now live to include all the building during her natural life. I give and bequeath to my son William four hundred Acres of land in

Henry County to include the farm whereon he now lives. I give and bequeath to my son John Wilson two hundred acres of land in Deeries claim adjoining his brother William on the Southeast side. Also I give and bequeath to my son Hamilton Wilson the tract of land whereon I now live Excluding my wife's part above named and give and bequeath to my beloved daughter five in number seven hundred and fifty acres of land in the s^d. Deeries Claim in Henry County to be laid in good form not to injure the sale of the ballance and my negroe woman Casander to be after serving the time which she may be hired after my decease. I also hold a receipt from William Caldwell to me for the payment of about twenty nine dollars which must be arranged by my admor. I also hold a claim of land of three thousand acres lying on the waters of Goose Creek in Garret County Kentucky which was held and to be equally divided between myself and James Kincaid the said land to be sold and equally divided amongst the legatees, also one thousand five hundred acres of land in Nicholas County on the waters of Casaday to be equally divided between the above named James Kincaid, and sold and equally divided among the heirs as above named and all my personal estate sold at publick sale and the apiles equally divided as above amongst the heirs In testimony whereof I have herunto set my name } This first day of Novr. 1813
