 perfect mind and memory, calling to mind the mortality of my
 body knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make
 ordain this my last will and testament. viz. Principally and first
 of all I give and recommend my Soul to God that gave it and as for
 my body I commend it to the earth, to be buried at the disposal
 of my Executors, nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I
 shall receive the same by the almighty power, and as touching such
 worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with in this
 life, I give and dispose of in the following manner & form, viz.
 First I desire that all my Just debts and funeral expences be
 satisfied as soon as possible after my Decease.
 Item I will and bequeath to my son Jacob Ruykendall
 heirs and assigns forever Twenty Shillings, Item I will and
 bequeath to my two sons Henry Ruykendall and John R.
 three pounds each, them and their heirs and assigns for ever.
 Item I will and bequeath unto my Daughter Rebecca the sum of
 pounds to her and her heirs and assigns for ever.
 Item I will and bequeath to my grand children that is Henry and
 John Ruykendall and Rebecca Shantons Children heirs of the
 boy all and every of the remainder of the estate I do possess of
 Cash Stock House hold furniture Clothing & Mobles and every other
 Individual belonging to me to be sold, and the money arising there
 from to be laid out in the purchasing of Land, the whole to be

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to be divided as followeth to the males as much more as the females and the same proportion to extend to their children unborn as to those now born to be given to them after they come of age.

Let it be remembered that my said Henry the said James and I have by this our last will and testament devised and bequeathed unto the said James and William all the lands and tenements which we have by purchase or otherwise lawfully obtained or lawfully may obtain in the County of Bourbon in the State of Kentucky together with all the rights and appurtenances thereto in anywise lawfully pertaining unto us and our heirs forever.
