by two acres of land more or less ^{which was} bought
of John Sanders and he the said Henry
Lighter is to pay or cause to be paid to
my daughter Mary if she is yet alive
less one hundred pounds and it

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deceased it is to be paid to the remainder
of my children, it is to be paid in yearly
payments by twenty five pounds a year
one year after the decease of me and my
