To my dearly beloved Wife, Sarah Longmore I give and bequeath the plantation that I now live on with all the appurtenances thereunto belonging to be divided out in such part as she will not stand in need of, with such part of Stock farming and Household Utensils that she may stand in need of, for the use of her and my two sons William and George Longmore, Untill the arrival of full age, the balance of the said Farming and Household Utensils to be sold, in case she continues my widow. Otherwise she is to claim her third part of the personal property with the third of of the Real Estate to be hers during her life, at which time her death it is to devolve upon the children my four named above, or to hold said land Stock, and Utensils untill the children my four may come of age. At which time and equal division takes place and each of my sons William and George Longmore and my beloved Wife Sarah Longmore are to take their equal parts of said Estate.

Lastly I constitute and appoint my beloved Wife Sarah Longmore and David Thomas and John Wether, Executors and Executors of this my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof, and to each things herein contained, I set my hand and seal, the 7th day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and Ten.
