In the name of God Amen, I Isaac Full of Bourbon County and State of Kentucky being in reasonable health of body, and of sound mind and memory, do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner following, viz.

First. It is my will and desire, that when I sleep in death, my body be buried wherever it may be most convenient, in a decent and Christian manner, and that some one of my brethren in the sacred ministry preach a sermon on the occasion to my surviving friends. Secondly. It is my will and desire that the expences of my burial and all my just debt, if there be any, be as punctually and promptly paid out of my estate as justice and propriety may demand.

Thirdly, I give and bequeath unto my adopted daughter Eliza Full Simpson one feather bed and furniture; one horse saddle and bridle which at this time would be valued at about sixty dollars; one cow and calf, three ewes and lambs, one breeding sow, to be hers and her heirs lawfully begotten of her body, but if she should depart this life without such issue, I will that what may then remain of these legacies shall be equally divided between my beloved wife Betsey Full and my son John Rankin Full.

Fourthly, I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Betsey Full one third part of the residue of my personal property, except my library, to be hers and at her disposal and

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one third part of my landed estate during her natural life, and afterward, I will and desire it to descend to my son John Rankin, and he under the same disposition as my land hereafter mentioned. - And further, I give and bequeath unto my wife Betsey one negroe woman named Dinnor to be hers and at her disposal, also one negroe woman named Fanny during my wife's natural life, and afterward, it is my will and desire that the said Fanny be free and held as her own property, wearing apparel, bed and bed-clothes. - I also give and bequeath to my wife Betsey one negroe man Jack until the twenty fifth day of December, eighteen hundred and twenty two; at which time it is my will and desire that the said negroe man Jack be free. - Likewise I give and bequeath unto my wife Betsey one negroe boy named Felix during her widowhood, and afterward, it is my will and desire that the said negroe boy Felix be the property of my adopted daughter Niza Full Simpson. - But notwithstanding, it is my positive will and desire the said negroe boy Felix be free at the age of twenty five years.

Likewise it is my will and desire that all Fanny increase during my wife's lifetime belong to my wife Betsey until the age of twenty five years, and then be free, and that all the issue of Fanny, female be free born.

Fifthly - I give and bequeath unto my son John Rankin Full one negroe boy named George until the twenty fifth of December in the year eighteen hundred and thirty, and then it is my will and desire that the said negroe George be free.

Likewise, I give and bequeath unto my son John Rankin Full all the remaining part of my personal and landed estate to him and his heirs forever, unless my son John Rankin Full should depart this life without lawful issue or should die intestate, being still legally possessed of said landed estate; then in that case, it is my positive will and desire that the

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third of my landed estate be equally divided
 between the children of Nancy Ballito of
 Maryland wife of Thomas Ballito and sis-
 ter to my first wife.

As to my library, I give and bequeath it
 to my son John Rankin Tule yet it is my
 will and positive charge and direction that
 my wife Betsey Tule shall have full free &
 unconstrained personal use of all my books
 or divinity during her natural life. I do
 likewise appoint my wife Betsey Tule the
 sole guardian of my adopted daughter
 Eliza Tule Simpson.

Moreover I constitute make and ordain
 my trusty friends William Forman Henry
 Inlows and Cornelius Skinner the sole ex-
 ecutors of this my last will and Testament,
