In the name of God. Amen. The first
day of June, in the year of our Lord, One thousand seven
hundred and ninety three.

I Isaac Ward of the County of Bourbon, &
State of Kentucky, being weakly of body, but perfect of mind
and memory, thanks be to God, for his mercies, & knowing
that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and
ordain this my last Will and Testament, that is to say,

First of all I recommend my Soul to the hands of Almighty
God, that gave it, and my body under his protection

And as touching my Estate, wherewith it hath pleased
God to bless me with in his life, I give devise & dispose
of the same, in the following manner I am to wit

I give and bequeath to my beloved Son John Ward &
James Ward, the land I now live on, with all its appurtenances
to be equally divided between them. My dear & be-
loved wife Elizabeth Ward, to have a full sufficiency of pen-
sionance for life time during the same from said John & James
the above John & James Ward, is to have & to hold and
right & solely exclusive of an equal division of my
Estate, each of them two houses, & they John & James
Ward, at the arrival of my beloved, in Switzerland, to
the year of maturity, shall pay him the said sum & also
the sum of fifteen pounds each, exclusive of his equal divi-
sion, of aforesaid moveable Estate. Item, Before
said Estate is to be divided, & all lawful debts to be dischar-
ged, whatsoever. My beloved Daughter Nancy, is to
have my small horse, as given and bequeathed to her as above
mentioned. Item, I give and bequeath to my
son Isaac, one horse & all flocks this Spring. Item, I
do give and bequeath to my dearly beloved wife Elizabeth
one mare, the dam of said Colt. Item, All moveable
Estate to be equally divided exclusive of the above men-
tioned to the best advantage. Item, John & James
Ward, to be my whole and sole Executors together with
my beloved wife Elizabeth Ward. (Turn over)

I do confirm this to be my last Will & Testament.

In the name of God, Almighty. Amen.

I Samuel Jarrison of Rowan County & State of Kentucky
being weak in body but of perfect wit and of mind & re-
ason, calling to mind the mortality of my body & knowing that
it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and declare this
my last Will & Testament. That is to say, first of all I commend
my soul to God, who gave it, and my body I commend
to the earth to be buried in a Christian like manner
at the discretion of my Executors and dearest friends.

130 receive the same as agreed at the General Assembly.

And with regard to my worldly Estate, I bequeath the
dispose of them in the manner following viz

Item. I give, assign, sell, convey and sell unto my
family, and bequeath unto my well beloved eldest brother
and Jameson's eldest son Charles, the just & full Sum of
Shillings.

Item. I give and bequeath unto Samuel Robinson, now
living with me, one bay year old mare Colt, come of the
mare that I sold to Benjamin Wadsworth.

Item. I give and bequeath to my well beloved and only
wife Rebecca, the remaining part of my whole Estate, real
& personal, including all debts, Bonds and Obligations, the re-
mains therein specified to be recovered by her, her heirs &
Assigns or Assigns, according to law and justice, as if by myself
in person present, of which Estate she is to be the only and sole
possessor during life and to enjoy it in that way that will be most
conducive to her happiness, and that it may be so disposed. I
do in this my last Will & Testament order that she choose one
horse, two Cows, and what number of Sheep she pleases, out of
my Stock, and that the rest be sold by Vendue, and the price
of them to be put to Interest, or to be disposed of as she may
think will be most conducive of her happiness in life. And
at her death, all that I now possess, except the lands on which I
now live, to be disposed of by her to whom she may think proper
to give it. After the death of my well beloved & only wife Re-
becca, I give and bequeath the same to my eldest son Charles.
