In the name of God Amen. I, James Hughes of Bourbon County being in a weak and infirm state of body but of sound mind and memory to prevent disputes that may arise after my decease among my family and connections do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form following.

Viz. First my will is that all my just debts be paid out of my estate. Item, I give unto my beloved wife Barshoba Hughes the House, Orchard and fifty acres of land part of the fifty acres is to consist of twenty acres of Wood-living land. Be it also understood that after my wife Barshoba Hughes's death the s^d house orchard and fifty acres of land are to belong to my son George Hughes his heirs and assigns forever also I give unto my wife Barshoba Hughes s^d Negroes Frank and Grace to belong to her until her death and after her death the s^d Negroes are to belong to my three sons Enoch Hughes, John Hughes and George Hughes they and their increase to belong to them their heirs and assigns for ever. Be it further understood

that I give unto my wife Barstuba Hughes the fourth part of all my personal estate viz the fourth part of all my stock, household furniture and the utensils about the farm. I also give unto my son Mason Hughes one Negro Boy by the name of Patrick to belong to him and his heirs and assigns forever. Also I give unto my two sons Enoch Hughes and John Hughes the ballance of my land which is about fifty Acres, to belong to them and their heirs and assigns forever. Also I give unto my son Enoch Hughes one Negro boy by the name Joseph to belong to him his heirs and assigns forever. Also I give unto my son John Hughes one Negro girl by the name of Easter to belong to him and his heirs and assigns forever. Also I give unto my Daughter Nancy Hughes one Negro woman by the name of Charity and also one Negro girl by the name of Boope to belong to her and her heirs and assigns forever. Also I give unto my son George Hughes one Negro girl by the name of Harriot to belong to him and his heirs and assigns forever. And in addition to the girl he is to have one hundred dollars in cash. I also give unto my three sons Enoch Hughes, John Hughes and George Hughes and my Daughter Nancy all my personal property after my wife Barstuba Hughes has taken out her fourth part, to belong to them and their heirs and assigns forever. And lastly I do appoint my Brother John Hughes my Executor to this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former will or wills whatsoever.
