time in perfect health of body and sound memory that as
I am bound by the will of my father which appears to be a
long passage and as all men are mortal and God
only knows whether I may be permitted to return to
settle my worldly business or not, I think proper to
make this my last will and testament. My design
my soul into the hands of God from whom I received
it when ever he shall be pleased to take it -
I desire - I desire my soul to be sent to him and
certain hope of the resurrection to eternal life with
our Father and who shall change our vile bodies that
it may be like unto his glorious body according to the
might of him who is able to subdue all
things to himself - I give and devise that
my lands and tenements and the waters as they lie
may be sold in order to pay of my just debts, and
in case that should be found insufficient for the dis-
charge thereof I will and require that my executors
shall also sell to the best advantage a tract or par-
cel of land joining the plantation on which now lie
it being the same tract or parcel of land which I
bought of my brother Richard and that the proceeds of
the said Executors if they should find it neces-
sary to sell any part of my lands or the payment
of my said just debts, and also for my said executors
to settle all my accounts and receive all debts due to
me - I commit I will that my loving friends and
the one half part of my whole estate year and person-
al and all my goods and chattels as I have devised
me by my father and I will and require that
sold I do desire that he may be appraised and
