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In the name of God Amen I James Henry of
Bourbon County, being weak in body but of
sound mind do ordain this to be my last will
and Testament, and do hereby revoke all former
wills heretofore by me made and do estab-
lish this to be my last will and Testament.

Item - I leave the farm where I now
live to the said James Henry during her
natural life as so long as she continues un-
married allowing her sufficient timber for the
use of said farm.

Item - I give and bequeath unto my grand-
children the children of James Henry my son
deceased the following tract of land part of
my preemption on River beginning at the creek
and two sugar trees on the bank of the
creek, thence north ten East with my line 100
poles, thence parallel with the first line to the
creek and down the creek to the beginning. To
them and their heirs forever.

Item - I give unto my son John Henry the farm
on which he now lives to be invested with the
title after one year. John's farm or tract is bound-
ed as follows - Beginning on my line 100 poles,
from the creek, thence North East with my line
to the old county line road and with the road
to Clinchfield line, thence at right angle, with
the first line to the corner of the tract of land
that I left to my grandchildren, the children of
James Henry dec'd and with their line to the
beginning to the said John Henry and his heirs
forever.

Item - I give and bequeath unto my beloved
wife

do to farm on which I now live during her
natural life and at her death or marriage
I then give the same unto my son Victor Henry
and Joseph Henry the residue of my tract on
River to be equally divided between them. But
it is my will that when the same is divided,
that Victor's part is to include the farm on
which I now live to them and their heirs forever.

Item - I give and bequeath unto Nathaniel Henry
my two hundred and fifty acres of land part
of my tract on the Locust Creek in Bourbon
County to include a spring called Lomine
creek to him and his heirs forever.

Item - It is my will that my executors sell the
residue of my lands adjoining the said and
the money arising from the sale to be equally
divided amongst my daughters Maria and the
Sallina Cordes and Peggy to them and their
heirs forever.

Item - One hundred and thirty six acres of
land that I bought of William Shickel on
Flat run adjoining William Shickel it
is my desire that my executors sell
the same and the money arising from the
same to be divided in the following man-
ner, five hundred dollars to Sally Bennett
my daughter and five hundred dollars to
my daughter Elizabeth Hatter and five hundred
dollars to my son Moses Henry to them
and their heirs forever.

Item - I give unto my daughter Nancy Rhodes
three hundred dollars to be paid into the hands
of trustees for her use and benefit to her and
her heirs forever.

Item - A bond I have on the heirs of William
Ray for two hundred acres of land, why ap-
pointment will appear, my will is that my ex-
ecutors sell the same and the money arising
from

 Daughters Maria & the balance Cordee and
 coming to them and their heirs forever -
 Then - It is my will that three of my negroes
 Dany Perry and Jack be sold for the purpose of
 paying my just debts and the surplus of my stock
 then - I give and bequeath the balance of my per-
 sonal estate to my beloved wife Peggy to her
 and her heirs forever - saving that she is to pay
 to my Daughter Sally Beldens one hundred and
 fifty dollars in addition to the sum of three
 hundred and fifty dollars which I think I
 have formerly given her.

Lastly I appoint my wife Peggy my James
 Rogers and John Barnett Executors and Execu-
 tors of this my last will and testament - Given
 under my hand and seal the twelfth day of
 March eighteen hundred and fourteenth
 being in presence of us James Rogers &
 John Rogers
