I James Fulton of the State of Kentucky and County of Bourbon being very sick and weak, in body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be given unto God calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last will and testament that is to say principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul to God that gave it and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian burial at the discretion of my exactors nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly estate as wherewith it has pleased God to bless me with in this life I give, demise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form.

First I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Polly Fulton the one half of my land and living and movable property while shee remains my widdow and if shee maries again shee shall have a childs part only I do give and bequeath an equal share to my three beloved children John Fulton, James Fulton and Peggy Fulton a bond upon William Mitchell
