In the Name of God, Amen, I John Baird, of Bourbon County
and State of Kentucky, being weak in body, but of perfect
mind and memory, do make and declare this to be
my last will and Testament in the manner following,
First and principally I recommend my soul to God.

14. who gave it, and body to be buried with decent Christian burial, after the payment of all my just debts and the necessary expenses of my funeral, I give and bequeath to Andrew Cochran, thirty dollars to be paid by my executors. To Samuel Gibson I give the one fourth of my whole estate after the above thirty dollars are taken out of it, to be paid as above. And the remainder I give to Thomas Baird, and Samuel Rop to be equally divided between them, but of Samuel Rop part, I allow the one half to be equally divided between my two grand daughters Polly Cochran and Jane Cochran. And I do appoint Thomas Baird my Executor of this my last will. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand, and affixed my seal this seventh day of September 1810
