1. The Vincennes Will of Levi Dougherty late of the Town
 & County of Paris Brown County, made at his habitation in his
 last sickness. It was the wish and will of said Dougherty
 that his wife Deborah should have the whole of his Estate
 after his decease; and it was his wish and desire that
 his particular friend Elijah Barton of the Town of
 Paris aforesaid should attend to his business and act
 as his Executor after his decease - We the undersigned
 Witnesses do testify that we were present in Levi Dough-
 erty's house on the sixteenth of this instant, when he
 said Dougherty in our presence and hearing did
 call upon Elijah Barton and did dispose of his Estate
 as is above stated - And that it was his wish, that
 Elijah Barton should attend to his business as above
 stated - Given under our hands this seventeenth day
 of February one thousand eight hundred and sixteen

 disposing mind and memory do make ordain and
 publish this my last Will and Testament (hereby
 revoking and annulling all former Wills and Tes-
 taments) in manner following -

I give and bequeath unto my three sons, John
 Samuel and George, the plantation whereon I now
 live containing two hundred acres of Land, more
 or

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it be to him and their heirs, Breves, equally to be divided amongst them as Tenants in common.
Secondly, I give and bequeath unto my said three sons John Samuel and George and their heirs forever, the following slaves, to wit, Stephen James, William Cooper, Pompey, Dice, Samuel, Jack, Rebecca, Ann, Henry and Anna and the future increase of the female slaves.

Thirdly, I give and bequeath unto my said three sons John Samuel and George and their heirs, all my stock farming utensils and house hold furniture together with all my money goods and chattels of every description.

Fourthly, And whereas my son William George Bruce sometime past purchased in Virginia with my money five slaves and took title of sale for them in his own name, my will is that his title to the said slaves be confirmed to him and his heirs forever and also his title to the slave pack which I once gave him, now in his possession.

In testimony whereof I have signed sealed and published this my last Will and Testament this twenty third day of October in the year 1819.

1. William Giddings of Dorchester County near Panaj. being sick
 and in body but in my right senses and understand-
 ing do dispose of my worldly estate as follows: I
 give to William Giddings my son the land on which
 I live which I purchased of William Anderson being
 containing one hundred and twenty acres more or
 less to him his heirs and assigns forever.
 I give to my son John Giddings my chattel girl
 named Nancy and her two eldest children Sen-
 nis and Eliza Ann to him his heirs and assigns for-
 ever except the said Nancy whom he is to retain
 till the fifteenth of June eighteen hundred and twenty
 two at which period I direct that she shall be free
 and emancipated.

I direct and desire that so much of my personal property exclusive of my slaves be sold as will be sufficient to pay me debts and is there be any deficiency exclusive of my slaves I direct that my Executors or Administrators have power to dispose of some part of my lands which in their discretion will not injure me for that purpose.

Silence that all bills, notes, accounts and judgments
