

In the Name of God Amen I John Dunlap of Lancaster County State of South Carolina being weak of Body but of sound mind and memory do this second day of November in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and Ninety one Make & Publish this my last Will & Testament in manner and form following Viz First I Write that all my Just debts be paid out of my personal Estate Also I will to my beloved Wife Elizabeth Dunlap my Plantation or Land and all I enjoy & together with the Plantation Implements and Household Furniture except such Articles as I shall afterwards mention Also I will to my beloved Wife all the Negroes I now enjoy except such Part as I shall afterwards mention Also one Negro Wench named Chloa Also one named Rowena also one Negro Boy named Jerry Also one named Jack Also I will to my Daughter Jane one Negro Girl named Nancy Also one mulatto Boy named Dick until she is the age of Twenty six years And in that I wish to be learned the Mystery of Phoenician and to be taught to read And I will that she come to the age mentioned thus to be free at liberty to work and labour for herself Also one Mare and Saddle I will to my Daughter two Centin and one Negro Boy named Captain one named Monday Also one Negro Wench named Adey Also one named Emory & Jane Also one named Jerry Also one Howard & saddle And I Charge my Two Wives and one third of the House hold Furniture And if one of my Daughters should die before the other leaving no issue I will that the Part which to her should go to the live and single of my other surviving Daughters and if both should die without issue then I will that my beloved Wife should enjoy the property until to them during her life and at her Death having no lawful issue then I will that the said Property be equally divided between & between her two Sons and their issue Also I will to my Daughter Jane one Negro Girl named Chloa and one Negro Boy named John my Wench and a parcel of Land I will to my beloved Wife the Bond on William Taylor

Also I will constitute and appoint my beloved Wife and Brother Thomas Dunlap my Executors in trust of this my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Affixed my Seal the Day & Year first above Written

In the year of our Lord, One thousand seven hundred and ninety three. I John Barton of the County of Bourbon and District of Kentucky, Sonner, being very sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and memory. Thanks be to God for calling unto mind the Mortality of my Body, Throwing that it is appointed for all men once to die. Do make and obtain this my last Will and Testament; That is to say, firstly, and last of all, I give and recommend my Soul unto the hands of God that gave it, & for my Body I recommend it to the Earth, to be buried in a christian like and decent manner at the discretion of my Wife, nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection, I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God. And as touching such Worldly Estates wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me, in this life, I give devise, and dispose of the same, in the following manner to wit.

Imprimis. It is my Will and I do Order, that in the first place, all my just Debt, & funeral charges be satisfied

Item. I give and bequeath unto Martha my beloved wife, all my Stock, such as Horses, Cows, Sheep, Hogs, &c. my Household Furniture, farming tools, Sinner, & every other tool as long as she both a single life to have full and free possession of the same. But if she should
