Also I give and bequeath to my well beloved Daughter Polly, all her Mothers Cloth cloths & Buckles and a gold ring that was her mothers; her mothers Bed and bed Cloths and Bible. also to my well beloved Daughter Nancy I do bequeath three pounds to be put to interest

for her use. And I give and Bequeath to my well beloved brother
 Nathaniel Glasgow a pocket and Breeches of Black velvet.
 And all other property that I am or may be Possessor of
